I have moved again. My last Company, because of some reorganization, was disbanded. It was not a happy time but the Army ordered it so there was no alternative.

I am now with the 55 Armored Engineer Bn of the 10th Armored Div at Camp Gordon, Ga.

The holiday season is now over. New Year's eve was for me very quiet. I simply
